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<u>June 6, 2023 (below)</u> - Analucia Cabanillas Cespedes was diagnosed with a Grade 3 gemistocytic astrocytoma on June 15, 2021, and a 7.5cm tumor was surgically removed. She went on to pursue nursing school at University of Florida which mandated she take COVID-19 Vaccines.



In May 2023 she was diagnosed with a new brain tumor, a Grade 4 Glioblastoma which is inoperable, has affected her mobility and has confined her to a wheelchair. It is "the size of a pear".

Oct. 5, 2023 – Ridgewood, NH – Brenda Eickmeyer was diagnosed with Grade 4 Glioblastoma in Jan.2023. She had 3 brain surgeries, chemo radiation and clinical trial infusions – and all treatments failed. She died after a 9 month battle on Oct. 5, 2023.

In this trying time, we kindly request your thoughts and prayers for our family. We are navigating through this emotional journey and are seeking your understanding and support for our need for privacy as we process our loss.

Oct. 2, 2023 - Columbus, OH - Tim McKenzie was diagnosed with Grade 4 Glioblastoma when he collapsed at home 3 weeks after getting married. He's had surgery, 6 weeks of intense daily chemo and targeted radiation therapy, but a recent MRI shows his tumor it not

responding to any therapy and continues to grow.

Please help Tim continue his fight with Glioblastoma and help with future treatments to prolong his life. Unfortunately, Tim can no longer work. He does qualify for COBRA that he can pay for out-of-pocket. It is extremely expensive each month, but it is worth it as it will allow him to have insurance and be able to apply for clinical trials and continue his chemotherapy. The funds raised will first and foremost pay for monthly COBRA insurance, allow him to continue physical therapy to regain his strength, and stay on top of all the current medical and household bills.

On April 1st 2023, Tim and Nicole tied the knot in Columbus, Ohio. They had a quick ceremony and celebrated their new marital status with a lovely steakhouse dinner, the day was absolutely perfect. Unfortunately just three weeks later, Tim would collapse in their home and learn he had a grade 4 Glioblastoma. The most aggressive and fast growing brain tumor with no cure. He had an emergency craniotomy which left him with permanent damage that affects his speech, gave him partial blindness in one eye and difficulty with reading comprehension. Despite all that they were very hopeful and optimistic that chemotherapy and radiation would shrink what little tumor was left on his brain stem and improve some of those deficits. Six weeks of intense daily chemo and targeted radiation left Tim feeling very weak, but he did not show signs of worsening so they took that as a win.

I want to thank everyone for their donations and give an update on Tim. Because of the help Tim and Nicole have received, Tim was able to activate his COBRA coverage and currently has insurance in to November. Once his coverage started, he was able to receive his OPTune device and schedule an MRI to see how the tumor was reacting to his chemo and radiation therapy. It seems like the tumor is continuing to grow so his doctors have formed a new treatment plan which he will begin in November. Because COBRA is a month to month insurance provider, future donations will be used to cover additional months of insurance and go towards this new treatment program which may lead to clinical trials.

<u>Sep. 29, 2023</u> - Huntley, IL - Ryan Ferguson had successful surgery to remove two Glioblastomas in July 2022. However, in March 2023, two new tumors grew back and can't be removed. In Sep. 2023, Ryan learned that his combination of immunotherapy, chemotherapy and anti-angiogenic IV infusions treatments are not working and his tumors are growing with a new additional tumor.

We're reaching out to you with a heartfelt plea for support as Ryan and Tracia Ferguson and their three sons face a challenging and unforeseen journey.

On July 23rd, 2022, after Ryan had experienced a host of inexplicable symptoms for numerous days, Tracia insisted she take him to a nearby emergency room to be evaluated by a physician. Following a myriad of tests, it was then that they received the unexpected news that Ryan had two tumors in his brain.

Ryan was transferred immediately to UIC, and on July 27th, 2022, he underwent a surgical procedure to remove the tumors, subsequently diagnosed as Grade 4 Glioblastomas—a highly aggressive form of cancer. Remarkably, the doctor was able to completely excise both tumors without encountering any complications, and Ryan recovered well. Following his hospital stay, Ryan was started on a course of chemotherapy and radiation treatments, and had regular medical appointments and tests to monitor his health.

In March of 2023, however, Ryan developed worsening symptoms, and he received disheartening news that two new tumors had emerged - this time in a location of the brain where they cannot be surgically removed. Ryan, along with his family and medical team, are confronting this enemy head-on, relying on a multifaceted approach comprised of chemotherapy, radiation, and other recently developed treatments.



Ryan and Tracia visited the doctor today for Ryan's check up, and they were given the discouraging news that the two existing tumors have grown and an additional tumor has emerged in a different area of his brain. Up until this point, Ryan's doctor had been managing his treatment with a combination of immunotherapy, chemotherapy, and antiangiogenic IV infusions. As these treatments were not yielding the desired results, the decision was made to make adjustments. The immunotherapy component will be discontinued, and the chemotherapy drug will be changed.

It's important to note that approval from Ryan's insurance is needed for the new chemotherapy drug, so prayers are appreciated for a swift approval process.

<u>Sep. 26, 2023</u> – Hastings, MN – 32 year old Zach Elliott has been battling a Grade 2 Astrocytoma since 2018. It was stable with chemo & radiation. However, in May 2023, it progressed into a Grade 4 Glioblastoma and no longer responds to chemo. He is now in hospice care.

Zach Elliott (32) Of Cottage Grove, graduated from high school in 2009. After he graduated, he joined the Marine Corp.

He met his wife Alicia in 2012 and got married in 2014 and begun a family. They have two beautiful boy Easton (7) Breven (6)

In 2018 Zach had a seizure at work and was diagnosed with an extremely aggressive brain tumor, grade 2 Astrocytoma. He had major brain surgery in 2018 to remove as much of the tumor they could remove. Unfortunately, they were only able to remove 80% of the tumor during surgery. He has been fighting a courageous battle with this ugly disease. He was going through chemo and radiation which continued to keep the tumor stable until it progressed into stage 4 Glioblastoma wild type which was deemed inoperable and terminal. He continued on chemo for four following months until the tumor stopped responding to treatment. They entered him into hospice care in September of 2023.

Aug. 30, 2023 - Middletown, PA - Susan Hodorovic was diagnosed with Grade 4 Glioblastoma on Mar. 23, 2023. She had chemo and radiation, didn't respond to treatments, had pulmonary embolism and blood clots in both legs and died after a 5 month battle.

Hello everyone. This is Sue's daughter, Rachelle. My mom was diagnosed with a devastating malignant brain tumor (grade 4) called Glioblastoma on March 23rd, 2023. 

<u>Aug. 24, 2023</u> - Chattanooga, TN - 22 year old Jada Nowell was diagnosed with Glioblastoma on May 17 after two weeks of headaches. She had surgery on June 2023. While awaiting a spot in a Clinical Trial at Duke, she got news her tumor was already starting to grow back less than 2 months after surgery.

Hello Family, Friends, and kind-hearted individuals who extend their compassion.

We are reaching out to you with heavy hearts but also with hope, for the life of Jada Nowell.

On May 17th, Jada got some really tough news - she found out she had a brain tumor. Just two weeks before that, she started having really bad headaches and couldn't keep any food down. She went to the emergency room, but they thought it was just a bad case of the flu. Even though she kept feeling awful, the doctors initially thought it wasn't anything serious. But when her symptoms didn't get better, she went back to the ER.

That's when the doctors said she needed surgery. They were hoping the tumor wasn't cancerous, but even the idea of having surgery was a shock for Jada. Imagine being 22 years old, someone who loved going to the gym and taking care of herself, and suddenly hearing that you need a major operation. But Jada didn't let this news knock her down. She's a real fighter, and she faced the surgery head-on.

On June 8, 2023, she had the surgery, and just a week later, she got more tough news - the tumor was a type called glioblastoma. It's a really serious kind of brain cancer. While Jada was trying to get back to her normal routine of walking and enjoying life, those nasty headaches came back. While she was waiting for a chance to be part of a clinical trial at Duke, which is one of the best hospitals for treating brain cancer, she got even more devastating news - the tumor was starting to grow back.

And then, on August 24th, Jada had to go through another surgery. Right now, she's in the ICU, fighting hard. Let me tell you, Jada is one of the strongest young ladies I've ever known. She's not giving up, and her whole family is right there with her, supporting her every step of the way. That's where you come in.

Three days after returning from honeymoon she had seizures and had surgery to remove three Stage 4 Glioblastoma tumors. The cancer returned just 6 weeks after first being diagnosed and "there was not even time to try any of the possible treatments" as Kiersten died.

Our beloved Kiersten Kay Bushman Stevens has succumbed to the effects of brain cancer just two months after getting married to the man who brought the biggest smiles and cutest laughs back into her life. After many years of hard work raising eight children, Kiersten was reunited with her college boyfriend, and on June 10, 2023 had an amazing wedding to Jared Stevens. They enjoyed an adventurous and joyful two weeks in Florida. Three days after returning home from their honeymoon, Kiersten started having seizures and was life-flighted to the hospital. She could no longer move her right arm or leg, and she was kept medically asleep for almost a week to prevent further seizures and more damage to her brain tissue. During that time, she had an intense surgery to remove three of four tumors found by MRI in her brain. The waiting for information and the watching for any improvement in her condition was excruciating. When all the testing came back, she was diagnosed with Stage 4 Glioblastoma – the most aggressive form of brain cancer – which has no good treatment and only a mild hope for life expectancy extension with chemo/radiation treatments. She was told she would have approximately 6 months to live and potentially a few more with treatment. This was devastating.

After her short fight with cancer, Kiersten was taken too soon and passed away due to the brain cancer's vigorous return just six weeks after first being diagnosed. There was not even time to try any of the possible treatments. The Bushman/Stevens family needs our prayers and assistance. We are hoping to raise financial support to relieve that burden from their thoughts. The funds will be used to help with out-of-pocket medical expenses, therapy, gas, meals during treatments, and funeral expenses.

Welcome to Bobby's Glioblastoma Fundraiser page. Bobby is a loving husband and father of three children. He and his wife Angie have been married for 23 years. His children are Savanah, age 26 and currently enrolled in college, Steven, age 23 and diagnosed with Schizophrenia, and Emma, age 17 and currently in high school. Bobby is also the single source of income for his family.

On August 17th, 2023 Bobby was taken to the hospital by his wife Angie. After an MRI was taken it was found that a tumor the size of an apple was present in his brain. The tumor was operated on and a good portion of it was removed. After pathology was performed on the tumor it was found that Bobby is suffering from Glioblastoma. Glioblastoma is a very aggressive form of brain cancer that is currently incurable. Even with chemotherapy and radiation therapy this form of cancer can only be slowed down. Bobby has been given 6 months to 1 year to live. On top of all of the medical expenses incurred by Bobby's condition, he and his family have lost a considerable amount of weekly income as short term disability only covers a portion of wages.

<u>July 21, 2023</u> – Olympia, WA – 51 year old Bob Price was diagnosed with Glioblastoma in Jan. 2023. He had surgery, radiation, chemo and metabolic therapy but 6 months after his diagnosis his tumor has regrown and is now inoperable.

My name is Sue and I'm creating this account for my son-in-law Bob. Please read this message below from his children.

In January of 2023, our lives changed forever when our father was diagnosed with Glioblastoma brain cancer. Glioblastoma is devastating: it is a highly aggressive cancer that is always fatal. This news turned our world upside down. He is only 51 years old. It is so hard to imagine a life without him. It is easy to get caught up in the pain of the situation and lose motivation. But it has been our dad that has pushed everyone to persevere. It is so inspiring the way he never gives up; all his life he has never been deterred by adversity and this is no different. Even amid this difficult fight, he seeks to use his life to inspire his family to reconnect with God and with each other. Through battling excruciating pain, undergoing brain surgery, radiation, chemo and metabolic therapy he has done everything to attempt to be there for his family and friends! Six months after his official diagnosis we recently learned his tumor has regrown and is now inoperable. Dear Christine Kesteloo and friends,

This fundraiser is to raise support for a long time friend, Lori Murry-Byron and her daughter, Madi Byers, who has terminal cancer and a prognosis that has been shortened.

Madi is 28 years old and was diagnosed in April 2023 with Glioblastoma Brain Cancer which has no cure. She also has Li-Fraumeni Syndrome which is a genetic mutation that predisposes those who carry it to developing malignant tumors of all types. Madi also lost her dad to cancer resulting from this syndrome when she was 7 years old. She had a craniotomy on April 17th to remove the brain tumor and her team thought it would be at least 9 months before they saw regrowth. Her radiation oncologist gave her a prognosis of 1 to 1.5 years after having the surgery and with radiation. Unfortunately, they are seeing tumor regrowth now, which most likely will shorten that prognosis.



Hello, my name is Camilo Henao Jimenez, brother, of Juan Diego Henao Jimenez. My brother was diagnosed on January 2nd, 2023, with Glioblastoma grade 4 - a rare aggressive brain tumour with no known cure and a life expectancy between 8-12months. Juan knew there and then that his fight for his life was just starting. Juan's only mission was the beat this cancer and continue loving and caring for his wife, Azeena and his two daughters Aliana (6ys) and Sofia (2ys).

Unfortunately, with only 2 cycles completed, Juan was told that his cancer had rapidly progressed, one tumor to now 3 rapidly growing tumors that do not respond to standard care treatment. No further resection is possible due to the location of the tumors.



May 23, 2023 – Shelby, NC – Kimberly Jensen had a seizure and fell in her bathroom in Oct. 2022 and was diagnosed with Grade 4 Glioblastoma. She had chemo & radiation but MRI in March showed treatments were not effective as tumor had doubled in size. She is seeking alternative treatments.

Kim's Fight for Life Against Grade 4 Glioblast

This is not just another cancer story; this is a tragedy of love and health. Our sister, Kim Jensen and her three boys, are once again battling against the odds to keep their family together. Kim's late husband, Ryan died 5 years ago at the age of 43, after fighting a long battle against a very rare form of cancer. Now, Kim is fighting her own battle against a terminal diagnosis of Grade IV Glioblastoma brain cancer.

- Kim was diagnosed in October of last year, after she had a seizure and fell in her bathroom, becoming unconscious and needing to be intubated upon arrival to the ER. She was transferred to Charlotte, North Carolina for advanced care and testing, where they eventually determined she had a large tumor in the left frontal lobe of her brain. Brain surgery quickly followed and many days of waiting concluded our worst fears: Grade IV Glioblastoma cancer. She then had a couple setbacks in her healing progress, requiring an additional surgery to remove infection and reinforce the infected skull with a titanium mesh plate followed by weeks of intense IV antibiotics. Finally, she was able to begin chemotherapy and radiation.
- Kim was just starting to get back to her business as a massage therapist this month,
 when her follow up MRI gave us less than hopeful news. This MRI was meant to
 determine how she responded to the chemotherapy and radiation. However, she was
 devastated to learn that the tumor has doubled in size since her last MRI in March
 2023. This means the treatments have not been effective and therefore will not be
 continued.

<u>April 24, 2023</u> - Santa Rosa, CA - 15 year old Darian Guizar died one month after being diagnosed with Glioblastoma. He only had one radiation treatment and had serious complications.

On March 16, 2023, our family received the devastating news that Darian Guizar (15) was diagnosed with one of the worst-case, worst-prognosis cancers, Glioblastoma (or grade IV brain cancer). Due to the severity and location of the tumor, Jesus, Jessica, Kimmie and Toby were told there is no cure or surgery to prolong Darian's life. The only course of treatment offered to help slow the growth of the tumor was radiation. He underwent his first radiation treatment on Thursday, March 30. After completing his first treatment his parents had to make the very difficult decision of not continuing his radiation due to fluid buildup, swelling and other complications.

It's with a very heavy heart Darian lost his battle on Monday, April 24, 2023, with family by his side.



My Take...

COVID-19 mRNA Vaccine Turbo Cancers are occurring at highest levels since the mRNA jabs rolled out in Dec. 2020. In my observations, Glioblastomas are in the top 3 most common COVID-19 mRNA Vaccine Turbo Cancers (along with lymphomas and breast cancers). Patients are describing the following additional features:

- Very large tumors (apple sized, pear sized, baseball sized, this is how patients or their families are describing these tumors)
- Even when surgery is successful, tumor starts to re-grow much faster than surgeons and oncologists were expecting.
- poor overall response to chemotherapy, radiation therapy, immunotherapy, antiangiogenic therapy
- when a brain cancer patient was in remission, the brain cancer returns, often more aggressive and inoperable.
- Very poor overall prognosis. Oncologists continue to tell patients they have
 12-18 months to live, but patients are dying within a few months after diagnosis.

COVID-19 mRNA Vaccine Induced Turbo Cancers are a new phenomenon. Oncologists are not recognizing it yet so they are unable to offer their patients proper treatment at this time.

It will be extremely important to listen to patients and their families and what they tell us about these tumors.
