LeBron James' son, **Bronny**, was rushed to a hospital after suffering cardiac arrest during a basketball workout, **TMZ Sports** has learned.

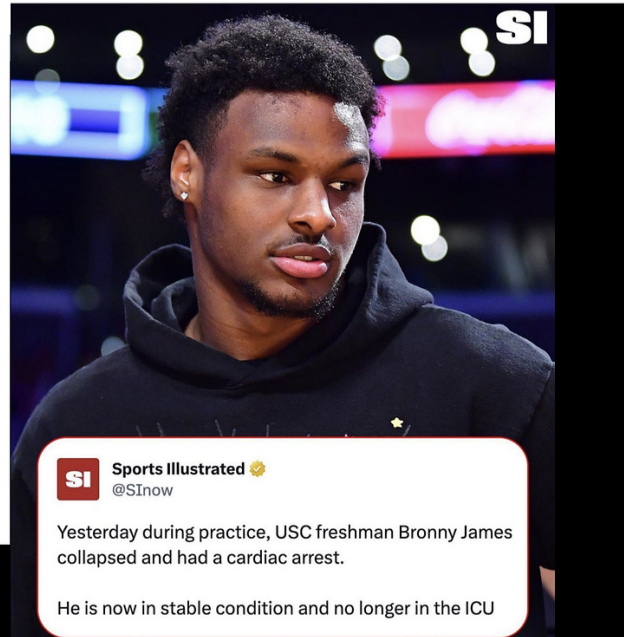
Our sources say it was a Code 3 -- meaning the ambulance lights and sirens -- which signifies the seriousness of the emergency.

Bronny is a rising talent in his sport -- he recently **committed to the Trojans** and is expected to end up in the NBA.

Bronny -- who was just recently seen looking fine at the ESPY Awards two weeks ago with his family -- was a 4-star recruit who averaged 14 points, 5 rebounds and 3 assists at Sierra Canyon during his senior season.



Sources with direct knowledge tell TMZ Sports ... a 911 call was made at 9:26 AM Monday from USC's Galen Center for -- the venue where the team plays and practices -- and the 18-year-old hooper, who was unconscious, was taken by ambulance to the hospital.

But the teen never showed signs of having a heart condition, his family told the outlet.

Bush had joined the football team to improve his health and conditioning, his brother said.

A high school football player from Long Island is on life support after reportedly collapsing during conditioning drills at Newfield High School earlier this week.

Robert Bush, 17, of Selden, had only been on the field for about four minutes before he bent over, then passed out due to a “cardiac event” at about 5 p.m. on Monday, his older brother, Steve Bush, told *Newsday*.

Despite the efforts of his coaches — who performed CPR and shocked him with a defibrillator — and the emergency medical teams who rushed him to Stony Brook University Hospital, Bush went without blood or oxygen to his brain for at least 45 minutes.

“There’s no more brain function,” his brother said Thursday, adding that the teen is on life support.

“We are dealing with the end right now.”

A mother-of-three has recalled her terrifying ordeal after she saved the life of her 17-year-old daughter when the teen went into cardiac arrest during a warm-up for a cheerleading competition.

Keianna Joe had been preparing for the event in Raleigh, **North Carolina**, earlier this month when she suddenly collapsed and became unresponsive.

Her mother Andrea, a certified medical assistant who works in a gynecology practice, leapt into action and began performing CPR for almost 10 minutes after not being able to find her daughter's pulse.

She was eventually able to restart Keianna's heart with doctors claiming that her quick thinking saved the teenager's life.

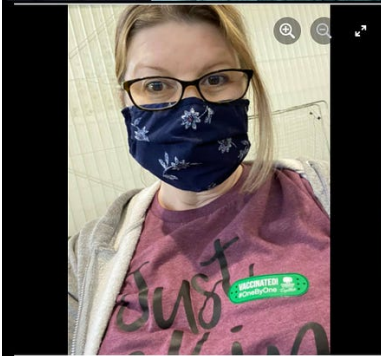

This is my son, he's 18 and checked out of Huron Vally Sinai Saturday afternoon after a 36 hr stay for diagnosed Covid 19 and acute pericarditis. Friday in the early morning hours I took him to the ER because he had severe chest pains, radiating up his neck and down his left arm. The EKG indicated "benign abnormalities" and then his blood work showed his troponin enzymes were 3500+. He had a heart attack. He's 18.

He went away to college in August and seemed to be sick as soon as he got there and couldn't seem to shake it. After some other, unrelated events, he ended up staying home and withdrawing from school. He's been home since thanksgiving.

They can't say definitively that COVID caused the myocarditis, but there is no other explanation and he tested positive for it. His internist said he's only seen this once in his career and it was in a 40 yr old. The infectious disease dr said there are other viruses that can cause myocarditis, but we have to wait up to 10 days to get the labs back for those tests. He also said the only way to confirm that covid caused this is to do a biopsy on the heart, which we will not be doing.

I know this is rare, but I just wanted to share with folks because I know his story won't make the news and I think we are all getting a little lax about the virus. Joe had the Pfizer vaccine and was double boosted. Stay safe out there friends. ❤️

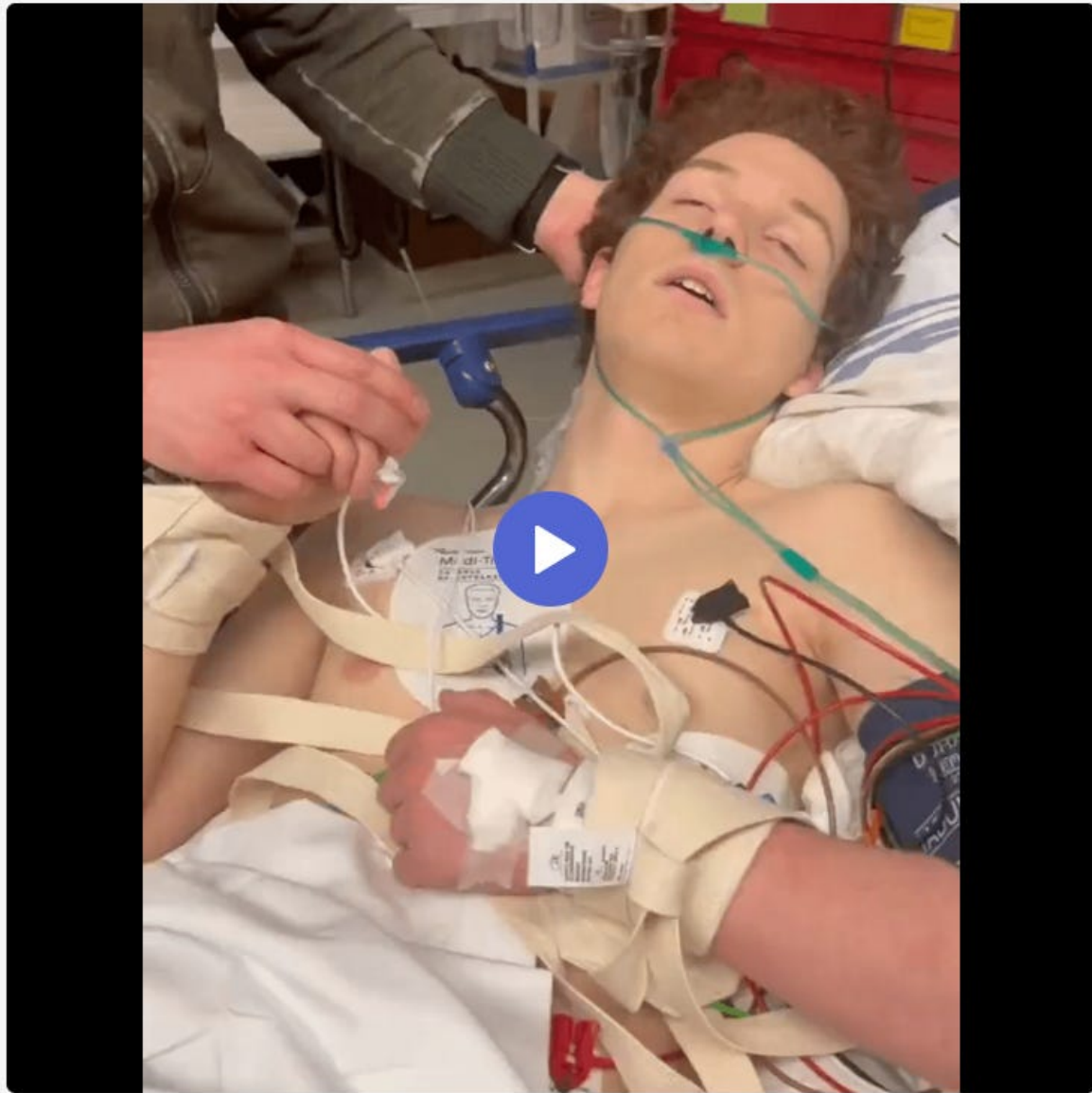

BRADENTON, Fla. - IMG's Nick Migliarese looks out over the track with a new appreciation for life. That's because last November, he collapsed at track practice.

"I was legally dead for three or four minutes," Nick told FOX 13.

Nick went into cardiac arrest. His heart just stopped.



Trainers performed CPR and jump started his heart. Nick arrived at the hospital in a coma and spent nine days recovering.

"Without them reacting as quickly as they did, we might not be having this conversation right now," said Mike.

Initially, the diagnosis was a genetic mutation, but now doctors aren't sure why his heart failed. Nick has no memory of the incident and has a defibrillator implanted in his chest to monitor it in case it stops again.

On September 10th, after a race in Pensacola, FL, one of Bartlett High School's Cross-Country runners suffered a heart attack. Gabe Higginbottom, 17, a junior at Bartlett High School was sent to Ascension Sacred Heart Pensacola Hospital at the advice of the on-staff medical team. Sacred Heart performed a CAT scan which revealed further action needed to be taken.

Gabe was transported to the UF Shands Heart and Vascular Hospital in Gainesville, FL by helicopter that night. In Gainesville, they found his right artery was completely blocked. The doctors performed an angioplasty to insert a balloon to open up that artery. Later, they performed a 3-hour surgery inserting two stents and found two blood clots.

Drew Strasser, 18, had just finished his warm-up laps at tennis practice when he lurched toward the wall to brace himself before slumping down, unconscious. His teammate and friend Jake jumped into action performing CPR on him while a coach, Jesse Atkinson, rushed to get an automated external defibrillator (AED) to jolt his heart. Their quick action likely saved the teen's life.

"I never would have thought it would be my kid," Laneia Strasser, 38, of Rochester, Indiana, told TODAY. "His friend, his 18-year-old teammate who works as a lifeguard — luckily he handled the situation right. Nobody knows how you're going to react to a situation like that, and he did what he needed to do."

Early practice ends in an emergency

On Aug. 5, Drew Strasser woke early and left the house at 5:30 a.m. to attend tennis practice. He drove himself to the school and started running warm-up laps in the gym when he suddenly collapsed.

Immediately, Jake started CPR while Atkinson rushed for the AED to assist while someone called 911. That day the team happened to be in the gym at the school, a lucky turn of events as there was no AED on the tennis courts.

"It wouldn't have been as likely that they could have saved his life with the AED had he not be inside the school in close proximity to it," Laneia Strasser said.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. — A Blue Valley High School junior is headed back to class Wednesday and thankful to be alive. Just two weeks ago he collapsed at baseball practice from cardiac arrest.

Seventeen-year-old Davis Dwight was at Mac N Seitz for hitting practice with Coach Nikolaus Crouch.

“It’s an incident that keeps me up at night at times. It’s an incident that fills my mind and my heart,” Crouch said. “I was having a typical conversation with a 17-year-old kid about a situation that happened earlier with him – he broke his wood bat — and then two minutes into the conversation he just passed out.”

Crouch yelled for help and called 911. Coach and former Royals catcher Mike Macfarlane came running. They said Dwight was not breathing.

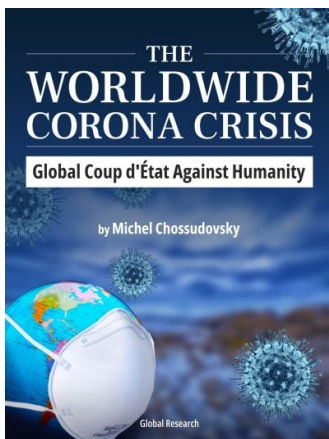
