Marine Sent to Mental Ward for Questioning 9/11

Former marine Brandon Raub was <u>carted off by the Feds</u> and <u>locked in a psychiatric ward for</u> <u>Facebook posts questioning the government's version of 9/11.</u>

Surely the Feds are right ... that kind of talk is *crazy*, right?

Maybe. But remember that government apologists are also eager to <u>label</u> anyone "taking a cynical stance toward politics, mistrusting authority, endorsing democratic practices, … and displaying an inquisitive, imaginative outlook" as worthy of a trip to the insane asylum. Should they be committed to the same psych ward which Mr. Raub is enjoying?

Raub's attorney – the head of the <u>non-partisan civil rights defense firm</u> The Rutherford Institute – <u>said</u>:

This should be a wake-up call to Americans that the police state is here."
