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Valley kids remember their pilot father who died while snorkeling during a layover

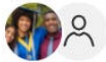
Keith Duncan leaves two teenage children behind. The aviation community is rallying around them trying to raise money for them to move forward.

We are still awaiting the results of the autopsy, but I'm fairly certain that Keith suffered a medical event (perhaps a stroke) which rendered him unable to swim or even remain buoyant. In addition to being an accomplished helicopter & airline pilot, Keith was also a Master Diver. And anyone who knew Keith was well aware of his fitness and physique. There is NO way he suddenly forgot how to swim. There had to be a contributing factor that precipitated this.

While he and his beloved girlfriend, Jessica, were not too far from shore, nobody could hear her screams as she desperately tried to swim him back in. By the time help arrived, he still had a weak pulse and they spent 30+ minutes trying to resuscitate him. Tragically, to no avail.

First, I knew Keith, but I didn't know much about his other friends or colleagues. I am not a pilot. I consider a flight successful if I remember to fasten my seat belt, put my tray-table in an upright & locked position, don't lock myself in the bathroom, and have my phone with me when I deplane.

So it was wonderful to hear such heartfelt stories, to many of which I can personally relate. But more importantly, I think it's been very healing and gratifying for his children and girlfriend to read your posts since it's likely they never heard these stories or knew how highly other people thought of Keith. In my tribe, we refer to people like Keith as a true "mensch." In addition to the stories you've shared, I encourage any of you with others to please continue to post to this thread.

Keith and I mainly bonded over car stuff. Keith taught me more about working on and repairing cars than anyone else I knew. But more importantly, and among his many gifts that some of you have mentioned, he instilled confidence in my ability to repair things I never thought I could. If I screwed something up (which I almost ALWAYS do) or needed help, Keith would always say, "I've got something to fix that. I'll be right over." And he always was. If I needed some oddball tool I'd call Keith and more often than not he'd say, "Yeah, I think I've got one of those and I'll bring it right over."

He died suddenly while snorkeling in Curacao during a layover. He suffered a medical emergency.

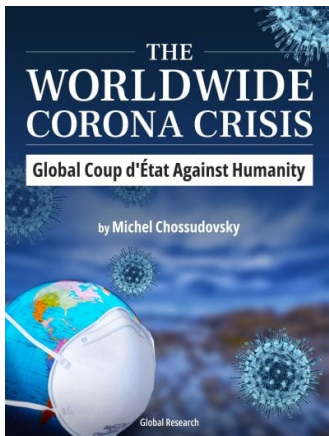
This is the seventh pilot to die suddenly in the past two months.
