Andrew G. Marshall contributed to breaking the Climate Change consensus in a celebrated 2006 article entitled <u>Global Warming A Convenient Lie</u>, in which he challenged the findings underlying Al Gore's documentary. According to Marshall, 'as soon as people start to state that "the debate is over", beware, because the fundamental basis of all sciences is that debate is never over'. Andrew Marshall has also written on the militarization of Central Africa, national security issues and the process of integration of North America. He is also a contributor to <u>GeopoliticalMonitor.com</u>.

He is currently a researcher at the Centre for Research on Globalization in Montreal and is studying political science and history at Simon Fraser University, British Columbia.

Muriel Mirak -Weissbach is an independent writer based in Germany and a frequent contributor to Global Research. She has written extensively on US war plans in the Middle East, focussing on Washington's ongoing threats directed against Iran.

Throughout the 1990s, she was the coordinator for the Committee to Save the Children in Iraq, a multipartisan coalition, which organized humanitarian aid for Iraqi children, including their care in German and US hospitals, which they could not have in Iraq due to the sanctions regime.

Since 1997, Iran has become a leading feature of her work. She has visited the country

many times since 1997, and has conducted interviews with leading political figures. Muriel Mirak-Weissbach is also a renowned specialist of Persian and Arabic culture and literature.
