John McGlynn is an independent Tokyo-based economic and financial analyst. His most recent article is entitled <u>Day of Infamy: The March 20, 2008 US Declaration of War on Iran.</u> According to John McGlynn, a unit within the US Treasury Department, the Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FinCEN), has issued a March 20 advisory to the world's financial institutions which calls for a freeze on all financial transactions with Iran. According to John McGlynn this decision, which is intended to isolate Iran, is tantamount to a declaration of war.

Brit Amos is the author of <u>Death of the Bees: GMO Crops and the Demise of Bee colonies</u> in North America published by Global Research.
