the Pacific and Latin America. He has served as economic adviser to governments of developing countries and has acted as a consultant for several international organizations.

He is the author of eleven books including The Globalization of Poverty and The New World Order (2003), America's "War on Terrorism" (2005), The Global Economic Crisis, The Great Depression of the Twenty-first Century (2009) (Editor), Towards a World War III Scenario: The Dangers of Nuclear War (2011). He is a contributor to the Encyclopaedia Britannica. His writings have been published in more than twenty languages. His latest book is The Globalization of War, America's Long War against Humanity (2015) which was launched during Perdana Global Peace Foundation's International Conference "New World Order" A Recipe for War or Peace!

Prof. Chossudovsky is a member of the Kuala Lumpur War Crimes Commission (KLWCC) which under the helm of Tun Dr. Mahathir Mohamad, initiated the indictment against George W. Bush et al "for crimes of torture and war crimes". (Judgement of the Kuala Lumpur War Crimes Tribunal (KLWCT), 11 May 2012) and on "Crimes of Genocide" against the State of Israel, (Judgement of the Tribunal, November 25, 2013).

He has taught as Visiting Professor at universities in Western Europe, South East Asia and Latin America, acted as an adviser to governments of developing countries and as a consultant for the several international organizations. Prof. Chossudovsky is a signatory of the Kuala Lumpur Declaration to Criminalise War and recipient of the Human Rights Prize of the Society for the Protection of Civil Rights and Human Dignity (GBM), Berlin, Germany.

In 2014, Michel Chossudovsky was awarded the Gold Medal for Merit of the Republic of Serbia for his writings on NATO's war on Yugoslavia.
